THE OPEN FIELD

EMM has been committed to reaching the least-reached people of the world for nearly a century. Our initial ministry to the Luo people of Tanzania was one of reaching out to people who had not heard of Jesus. This continues to be a central focus for EMM: going to places with "open fields." Our current Kingdom Multiplication Vision is focused on sharing the good news of Jesus in places where there is not an established evangelical church presence, like Central Asia, Central Europe, Southeast Asia, and West Africa.

Many of EMM's supporters and missionaries have come from agricultural backgrounds. This metaphor — Four Fields of Kingdom Growth — is a helpful way to think about how together we are able to play a part in sowing seeds of hope around the world. Any good farmer knows that a field isn't actually empty, but needs work to prepare the soil to plant the seed. This step may take time — for missionaries, this step might take years of working the soil until finally it's ready. This requires perseverance and commitment.

In places like Central Asia, we find that the spiritual climate is nearly as unforgiving as its cold rocky mountains are for agriculture. This region is home to many least-reached people groups, many of them Muslim. For example, for the Uzbek people, totaling more than 31 million across multiple countries, only 0.03% (3 in 10,000!) know Jesus. Harsh climates, restrictive governments, and religious opposition make these people groups particularly difficult for missionaries. EMM has had historic engagement in a number of countries and currently has workers in the region.

In the 11 countries that make up the geographic region of Southeast Asia, there are more than 680 million people! The Joshua Project estimates that nearly 53 percent of the people in this region would be identified as least-reached. This means people groups "among which there is no indigenous community of believing Christians with adequate numbers and resources to evangelize this people group without outside assistance."

In 1957, the first two EMM missionary families arrived in Saigon, Vietnam. This was the beginning of EMM's long investment in this region of the world. Eventually, EMM entered other countries in Southeast Asia, like the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Cambodia, and a sensitive country.

Today, we have workers serving in Cambodia, Thailand, and one sensitive country. In addition, we have important partnerships with several national churches. In fact, an incredible revival is happening among the Mennonite churches in Vietnam in which thousands of people are coming to Jesus. The Philippine Mennonites are also embracing a new vision to join with EMM in sending workers to the Isaan people of Thailand. We are thrilled that the Peru Evangelical Mennonite Church sent a young man to serve among the Isaan people. Several decades ago, the Quechua people of Peru were a least-reached people group, but through the ministries of EMM in Peru, a movement formed, which is now playing an important role in reaching people in Thailand.

In Mark 4, Jesus tells the Parable of the Sower in which he explains the fate of scattered seed in a number of places: the path, the rocky soil, the thorns, and the good soil. Sowing may require more persistence, until the soil is ready for the seed to take root. Sadly, there will still be places in which the seed is still not given the chance to really grow. However, plants cannot grow if they aren't sown. This is the critical work of EMM workers who go out around the world and try to bring the good news of Jesus to people who have not heard this message of hope.

In places like Central Europe, EMM workers are creatively sowing seed among people who are now living in a post-Christendom environment. For missiological purposes, we define Central Europe as nations in the geographic center of Europe that were not part of the Soviet Union but were influenced by communism and now have significant non-religious populations. In 1951, EMM workers in Luxembourg found an incredible way to reach past the Iron Curtain and share the gospel via a radio program with people in places like East Germany, Hungary, and Poland.

Decades after this first effort to reach people in Central Europe, EMM continued to send workers to different locations with a goal of sharing the good news of Jesus with people who did not have a relationship with Him. Today, our team serves in places like Germany, the Czech Republic, Romania, and Albania with ministry to people from Muslim backgrounds, post-Christendom Europeans, and refugees.

West Africa is home to hundreds of least-reached people groups, including animistic peoples and Muslims. One of these is the Mandinka people, numbering over 2 million in West Africa, with less than 1% identifying as Christians. Mission agencies have traditionally focused on coastal areas — many inland villages remain least-reached. These countries have some of the lowest GDP in the world, with most of the population living below the poverty line.

This mission work began in West Africa with a focus on establishing communities of faith and training local leaders. The ministry successfully adapted to local customs while laying the foundation for the Mennonite Church of West Africa. This enduring church body continues its work today under the direction of the indigenous leaders developed through the efforts of missionary Beryl Forrester, who remained committed to the region until his death in 2021.


Today, the Mennonite Church West Africa has a vision to be a church planting movement throughout the region. In fact, this burgeoning network of churches began in The Gambia and has grown into Guinea-Bissau and Guinea (Conakry) with a goal of reaching into other nations in West Africa. These churches are growing, thriving, and discipling leaders, along with support from EMM workers.

DECEMBER DAILY PRAYER

SOUTHEAST ASIA

- 1 | Join Gerry and Donna Keener in prayer for the recently formed Evangelical Peacebuilding Team in Vietnam to grow skills in coaching and mediation to effectively guide people through conflict in order to experience reconciled relationships in marriages, families, and in the church.
- 2 | Pray for William Higgins as he prepares to teach in March in Vietnam, including a new course on the Gospel of Mark. Pray that things will go well and that the material will equip and bless the students and leaders who gather.
- 3 | Pray for the Burmese people living in Cambodia. The Burmese are predominantly Buddhist. The traditional goal in Buddhism is to seek the middle path to nirvana, or the ultimate peace. Pray that they would encounter Christ and find peace in him.
- 4 | Pray for God to call pioneer church planters into the harvest field of Thailand to join the team there.
- 5 | Pray for workers to be called to Thailand, to work with displaced people from Myanmar.
- 6 | Pray for God to continue to prompt young adults to explore a call to missions through a mission internship with EMM in Southeast Asia.

LANCASTER, PA.

- 7 | Pray for discernment and connections for Jan Heindel as she seeks partners and opportunities to offer spiritual care to local and expat communities.
- 8 | Ask God to empower the EMM Finance Team to wrap up the year well in work and in personal health.
- 9 | Pray for God to move his people to give generously to the Impact Fund at the end of the year to cover EMM's financial needs for 2025.
- 10 | Pray for God to call volunteers for the programs at Neighbors Community Center, at Hub450, our building in Lancaster, PA.
- 11 | Ask the Lord to fulfill the various staffing needs for the EMM central administrative office.

CENTRAL EUROPE

12 | Pray that God would give Vojta and Stacy Prknovi local teammates in the Czech Republic for a closer connection in church planting.

- 13 | Pray for Kazakhs living in the Czech Republic. Their tribal culture is waning in urban locations like those in the Czech Republic. Pray that they would find Christ, and be able to ultimately identify in him.
- 14 | Pray for the Indonesian people, most of whom are Sunni Muslims, living in Germany. Most Indonesians in Germany are their for education or for work. Pray that they would be curious about Jesus and seek answers to their questions.
- 15 | Pray for the Bosniak peoples living in the Czech Republic, for most of whom Islamic identity has more to do with cultural roots than with religious beliefs. Ask the Lord to reveal himself to them in a way that resonates deeply with them.
- 16 | Pray for God to continue to prompt young adults to explore a call to missions through a mission internship with EMM in Central Europe.

CENTRAL ASIA

- 17 | Join Elizabeth* praising the Lord for sending some amazing and specific answers to her October request about her family visiting. From December 15 through 18, about ten local women from around the county will be meeting in a central city to fast, pray, and seek the Lord together. Join them in asking for God-encounters that lead to personal and wide-scale breakthroughs.
- 18 | Pray for God to send workers to the field to work in business for transformation and teaching English.
- 19 | Pray for God to continue to prompt young adults to explore a call to missions through a mission internship with EMM in Central Asia.
- 20 | Pray for the Balkar people in Kyrgzstan. In their culture, every aspect of life, from birth, to marriage, to death, is governed by folk-Islamic and Balkar traditions. Pray that they would experience the love of Christ and be transformed through relationship with him.
- 21 | Pray for the Kalmyk-Oirat people in Uzbekistan. Many practice shamanism which includes black magic and secret arts. These have been practiced for hundreds of years. Pray that they would find the light of Christ, and would be able to exchange those practices for trust in Jesus.

WEST AFRICA

- 22 | Please pray for the people of Bonthe district in Sierra Leone, that the Light of Christ will dispel spiritual darkness. Pray that the Christmas celebration hosted by Nyandengoh! for children with disabilities and their families will bring hope and encouragement.
- 23 | Pray for the Northern Bullom people in Sierra Leone, one of the largest ethnic groups in the country. Pray that they would experience the life-changing power of Christ, and be empowered to share him with their neighbors.
- 24 | Pray for the Hausa people in The Gambia. The Hausa people are the largest ethnic group in all of West Africa. Pray for a powerful Jesus movement around them that can spread across all of the region.
- 25 | Pray for God to continue to prompt young adults to explore a call to missions through a mission internship with EMM in West Africa.
- 26 | Pray for Nate and Krystle Thorne and their children as they serve in The Gambia. Pray for perseverance for them, and for refreshing times interacting in supportive church community.
- 27 | Pray for the Gola people living in Sierra Leone. They are concentrated mostly in the small provinces of Kenema and Pujehun. A Gola translation of the New Testament was recently completed in 2020. Pray that work will be continued so that the Old Testament can also be translated

OTHER PARTS OF THE WORLD

- 28 | Join Tim and Julie Groff in prayer for more healthy employment opportunities in Belize. Many of their neighbors are unemployed, and many of the jobs that are available do not provide a living wage.
- 29 | Join Alan and Carol Wert in praying for the children who will receive free Christmas gifts from The Hive community center, Cardiff, Wales, where Alan serves as facility manager.
- 30 | Join Austin and Griselda Zuercher in prayer for wisdom as they guide the base's vision and the young adult staff. Pray for Griselda as she leads El Nido and for the young women to find hope in Jesus.
- 31 | Isaiah 9:1-3 foretold Jesus' coming and ministry in Galilee. Many people around the world still walk in darkness. Pray for God the Father to send his Son's light among them via his children, so that there can be great joy among all the people in his enlarging family.
